- 3.To help us to support the social welfare, and improve the conditions of life, of our community.



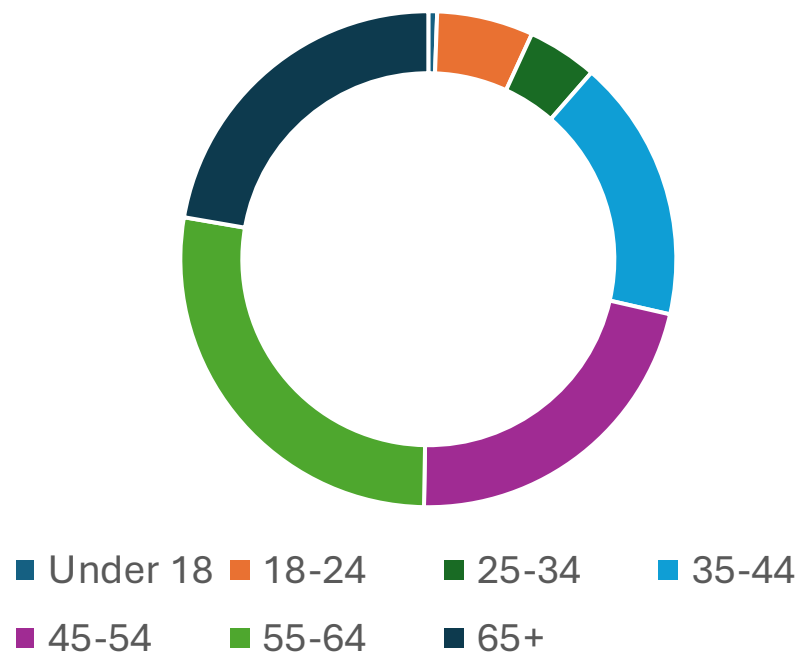

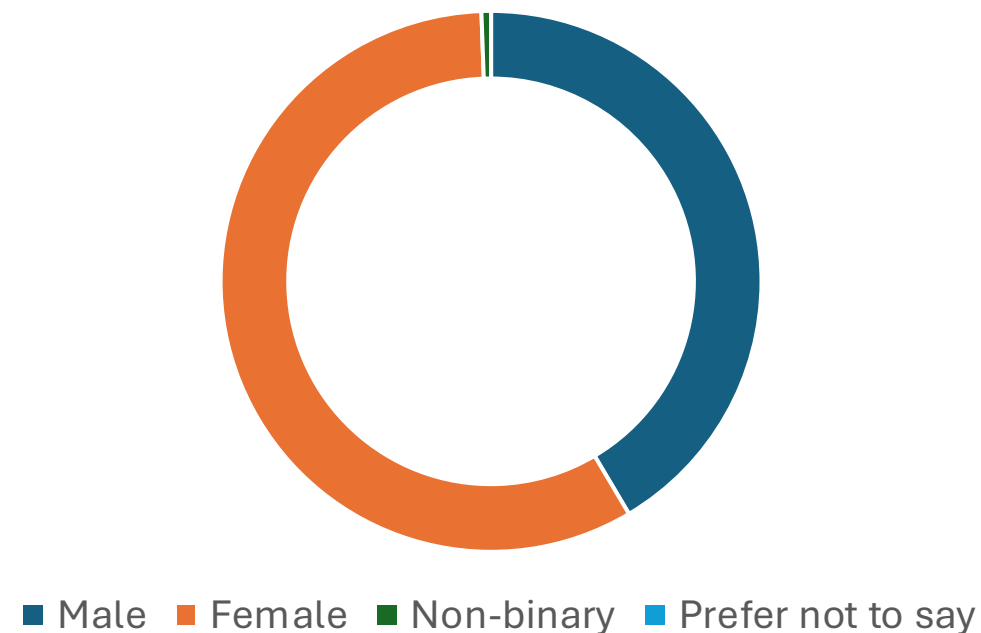

How old are you?

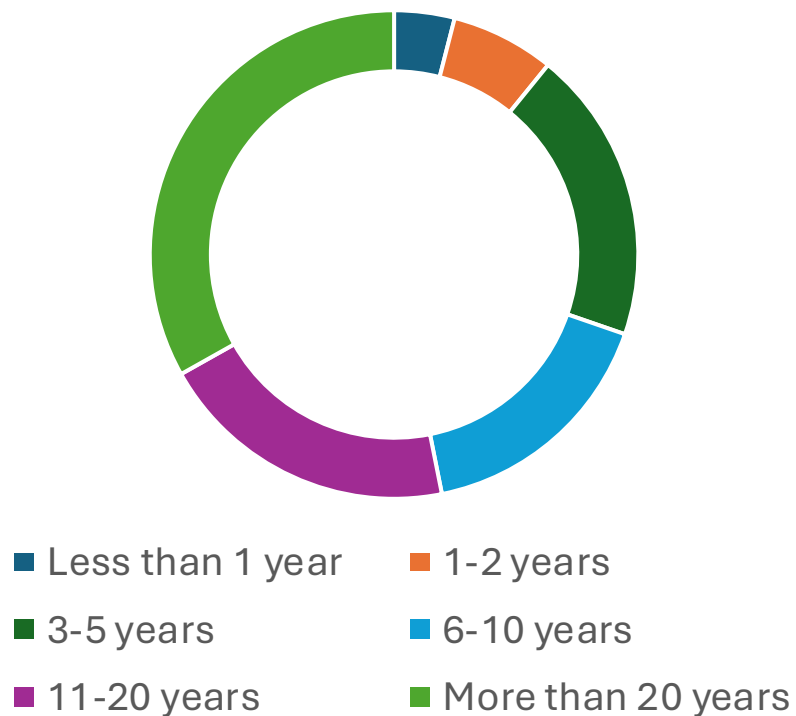


How would you describe your gender?

How long have you lived in Crondall?

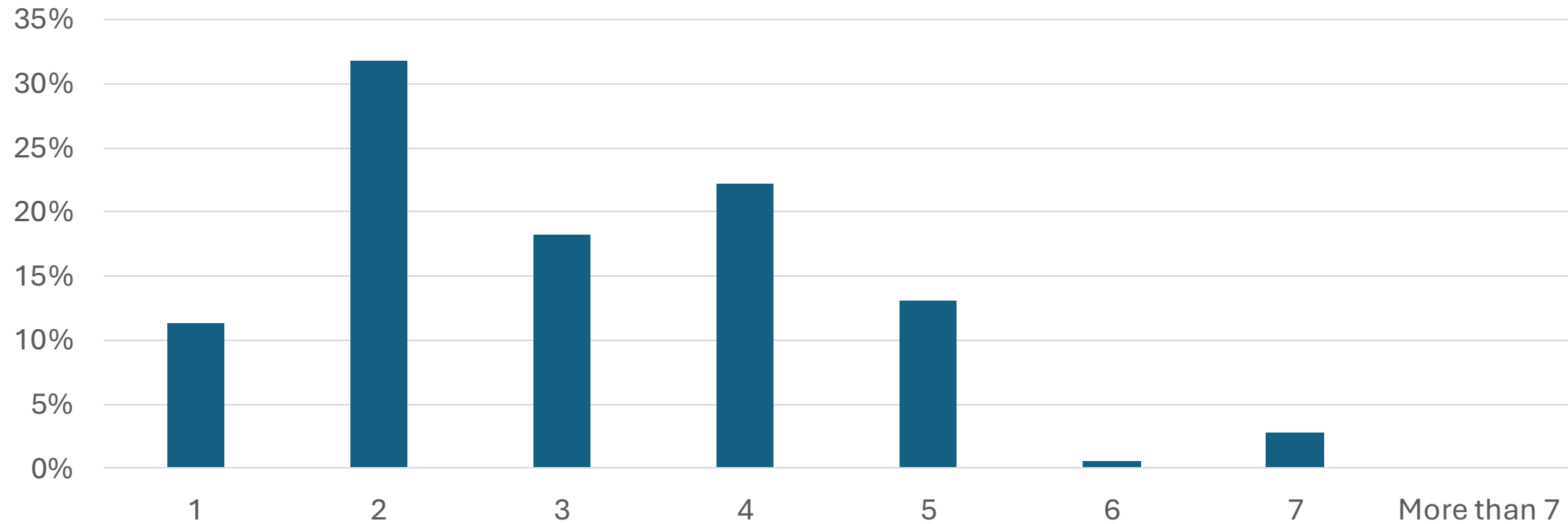


Do you have children?

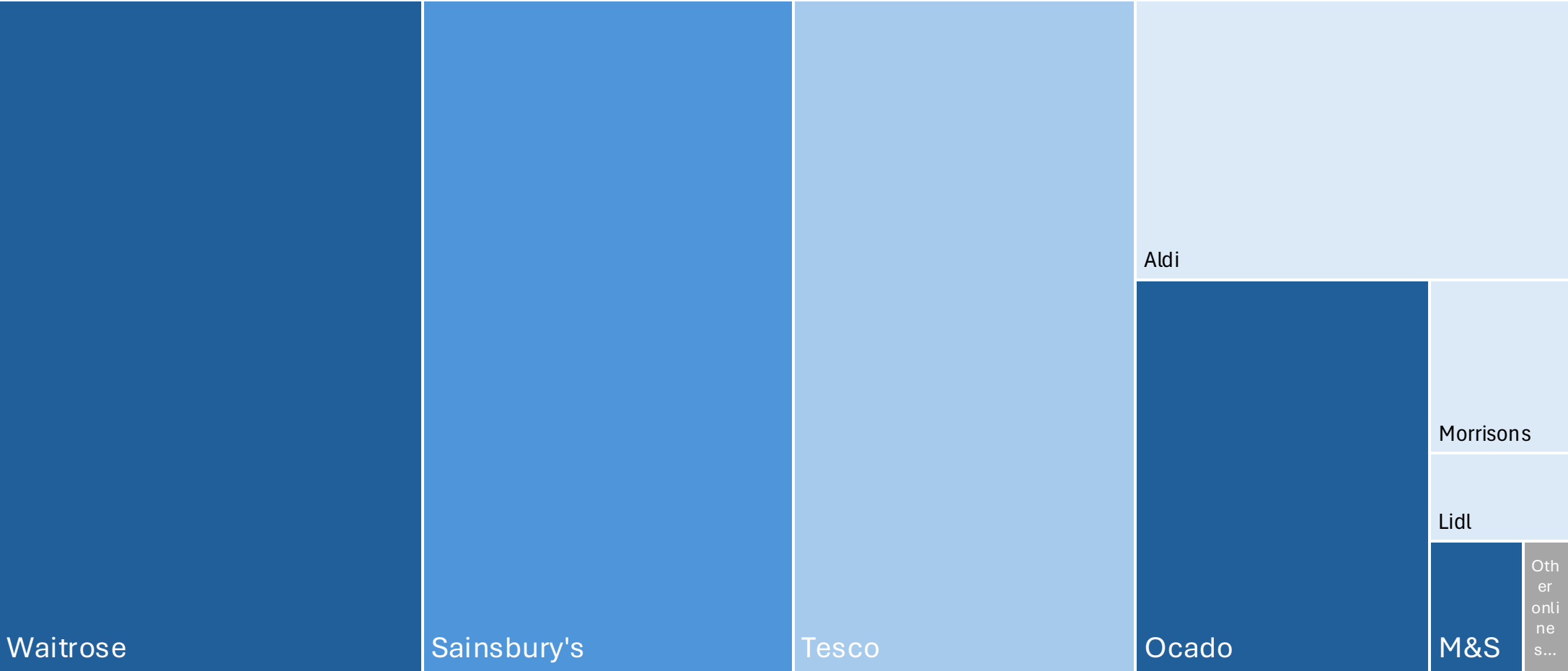
How many people currently live in your home?

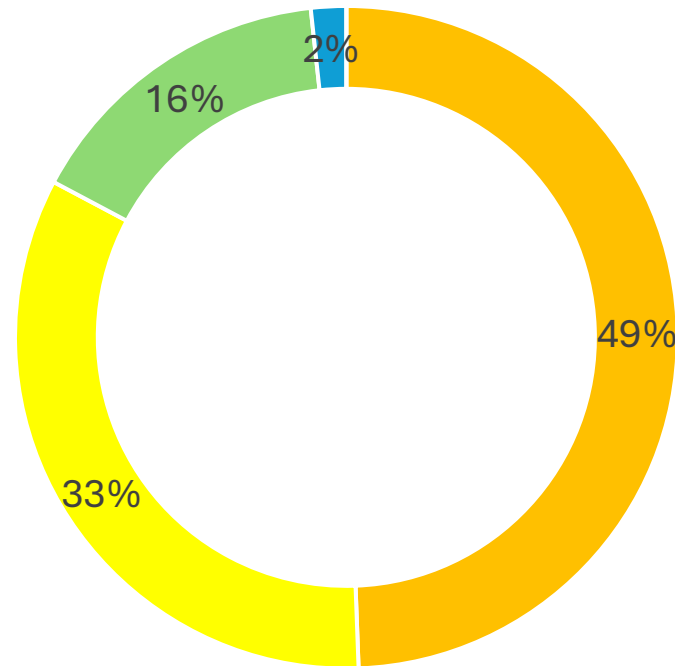


Where do you normally buy most of your food?

How would you describe your general experience of living in Crondall?

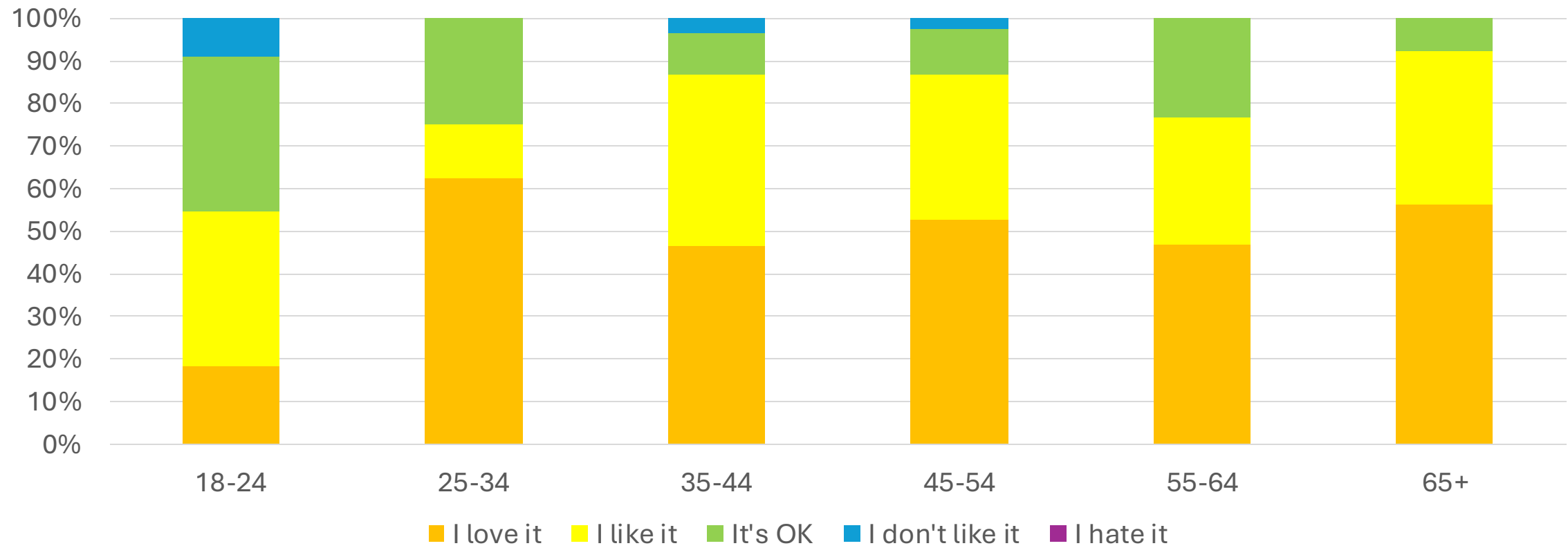

But just how happy depends on a few things, like how old you are...

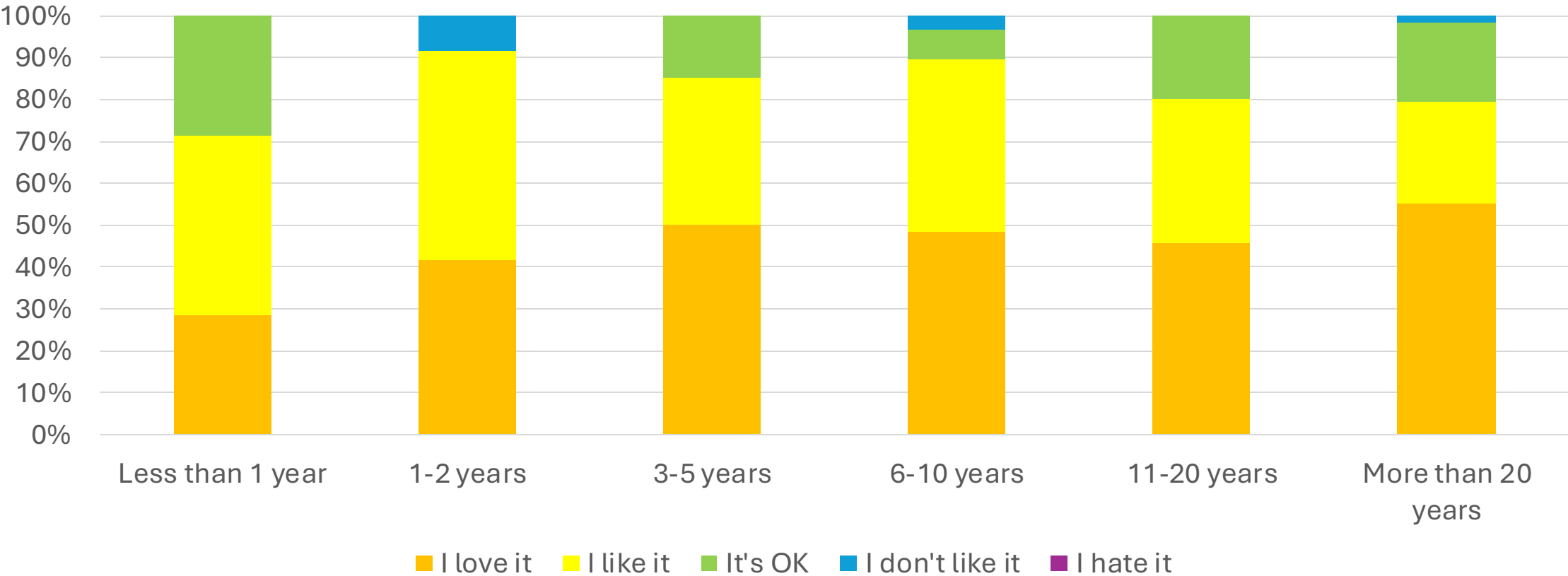


How would you describe your overall experience of living in Crondall?
Comparing answers by age of respondent.



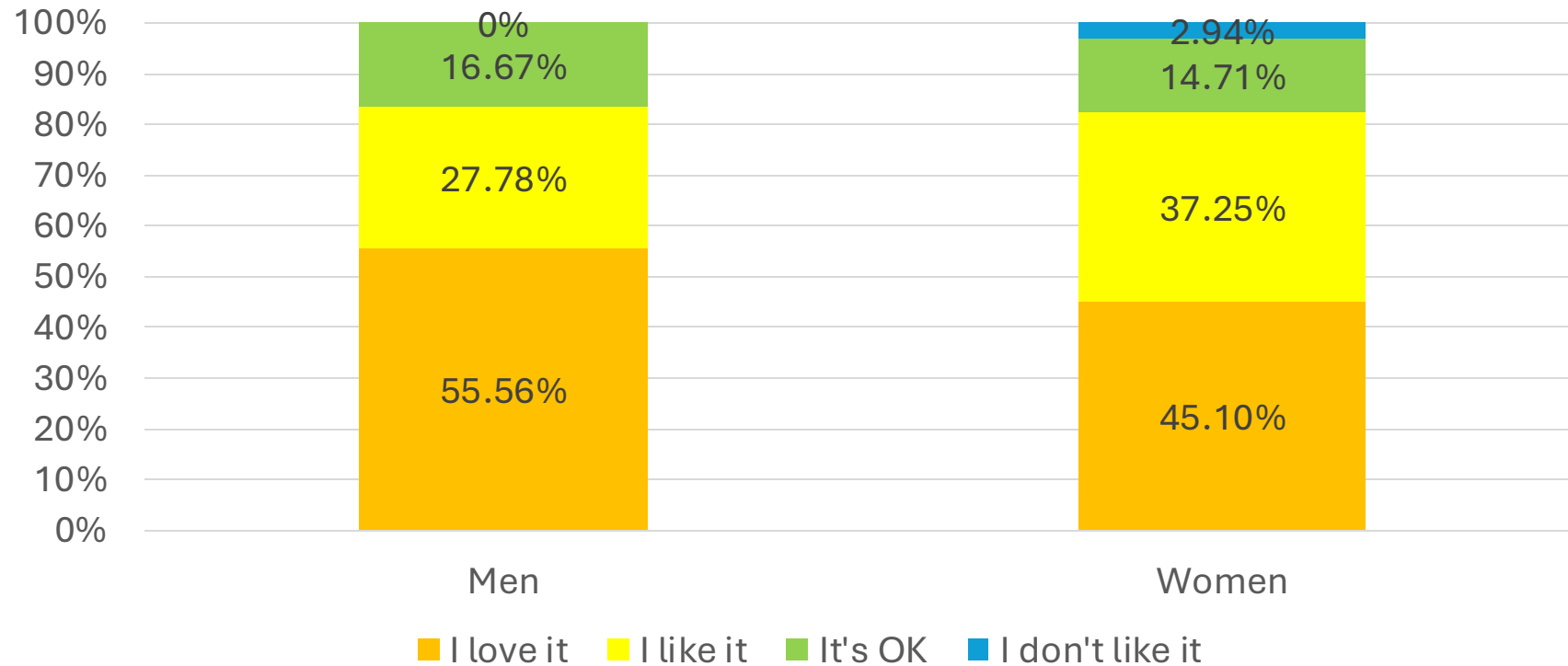
...and how long you've been living here...

Comparing answers by length of time living in Crondall.



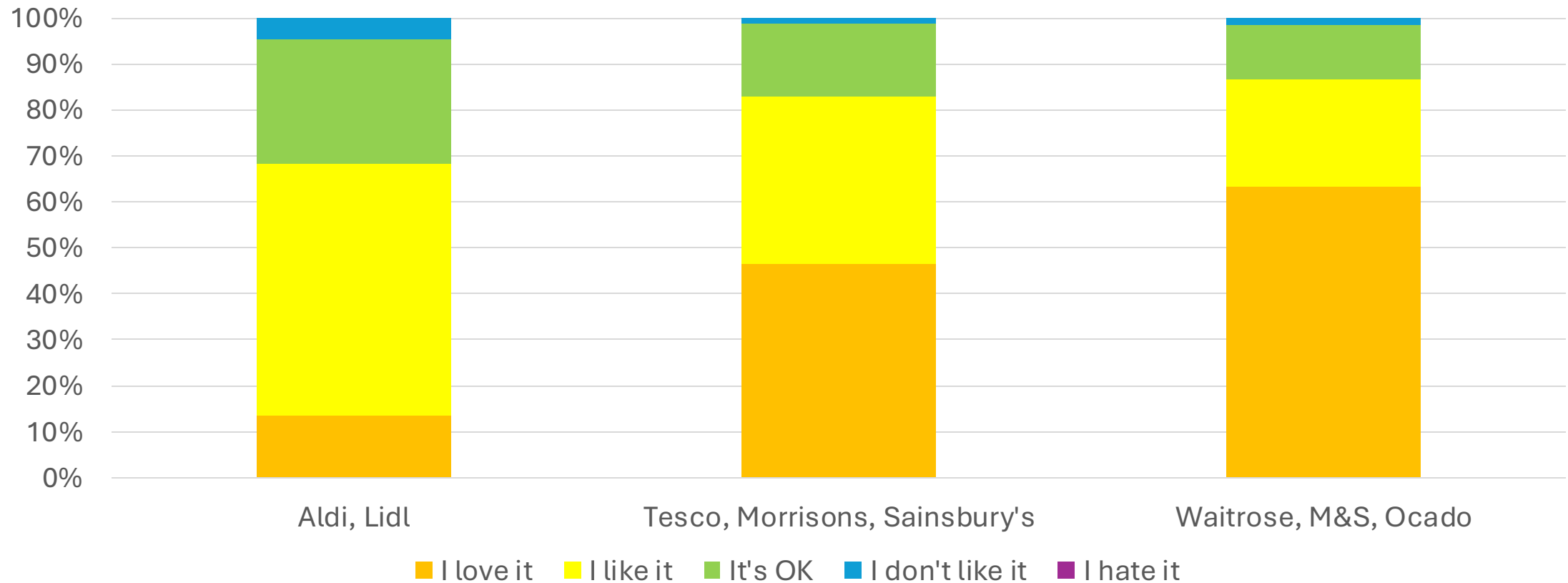
...and whether you're a man or a woman...

...and even where you shop

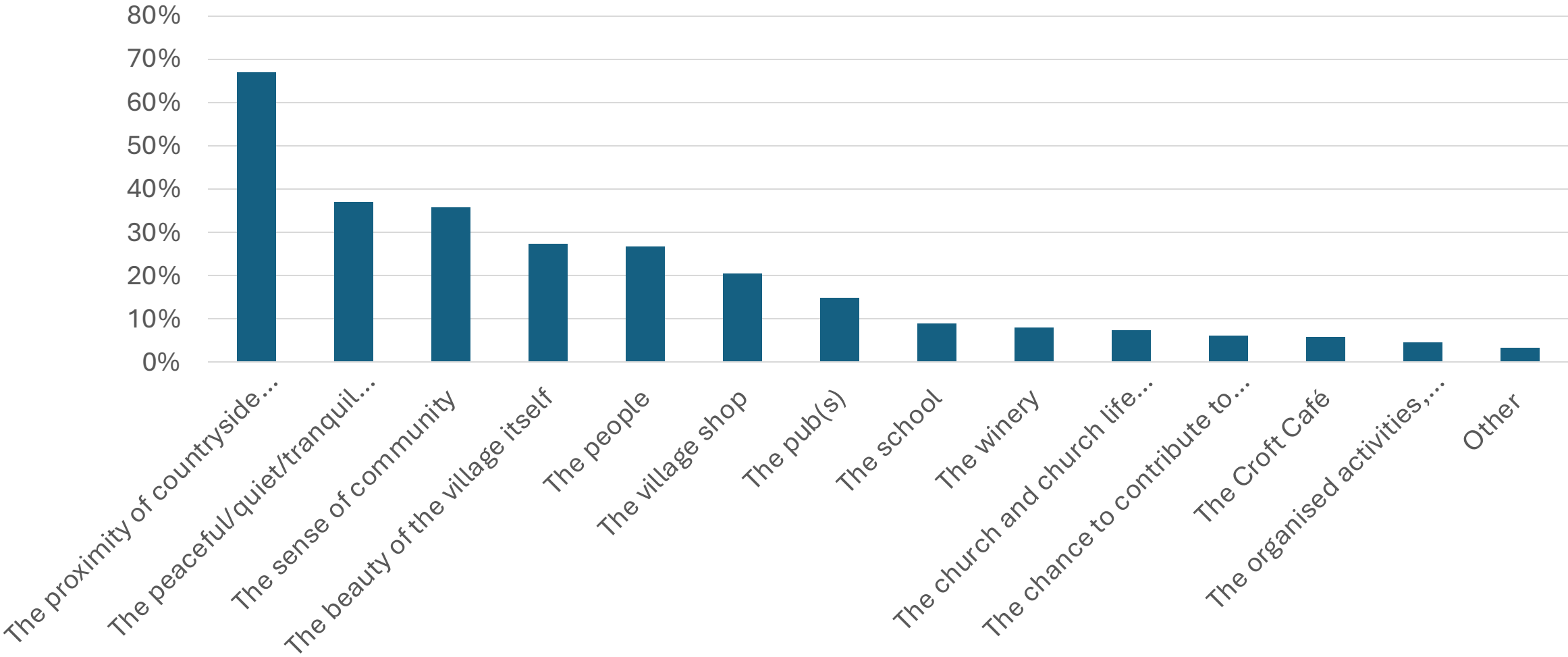
How would you describe your overall experience of living in Crondall?
Comparing answers by where people normally buy most of their food (grouped)



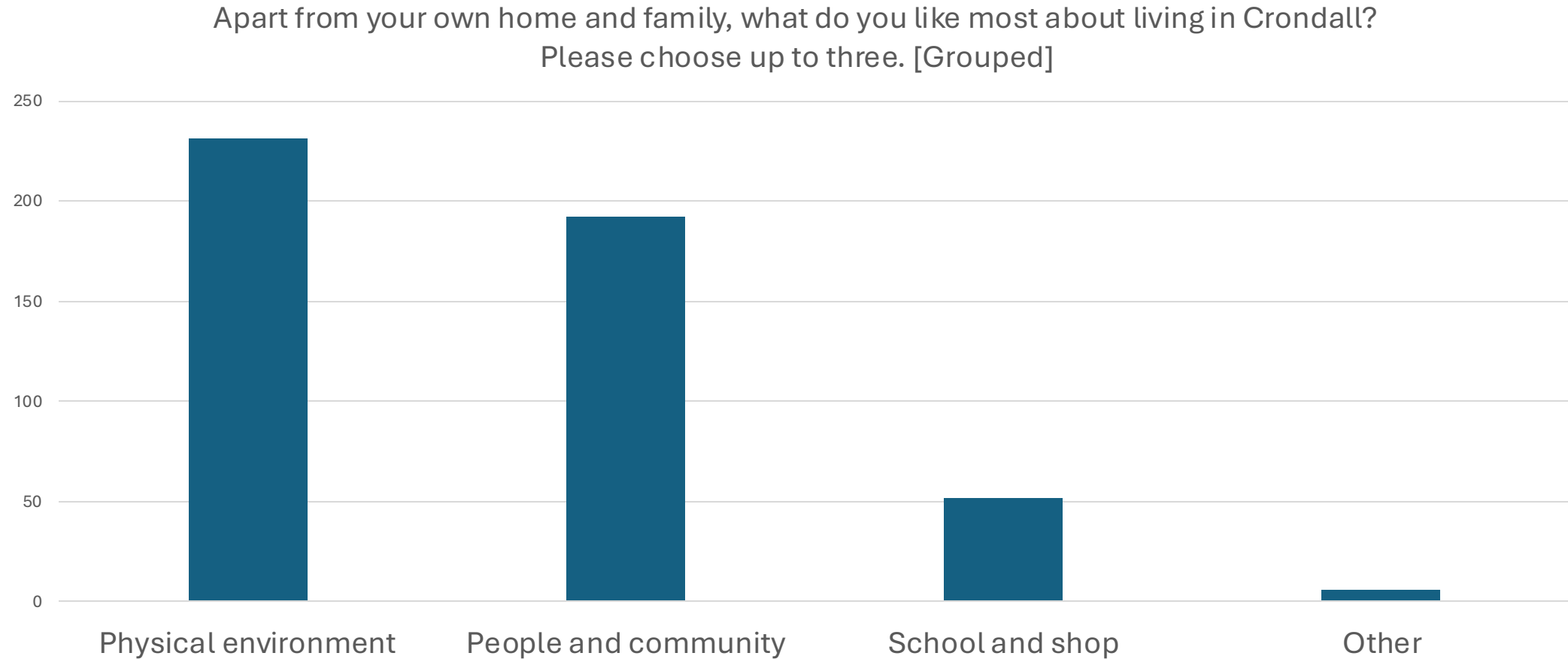

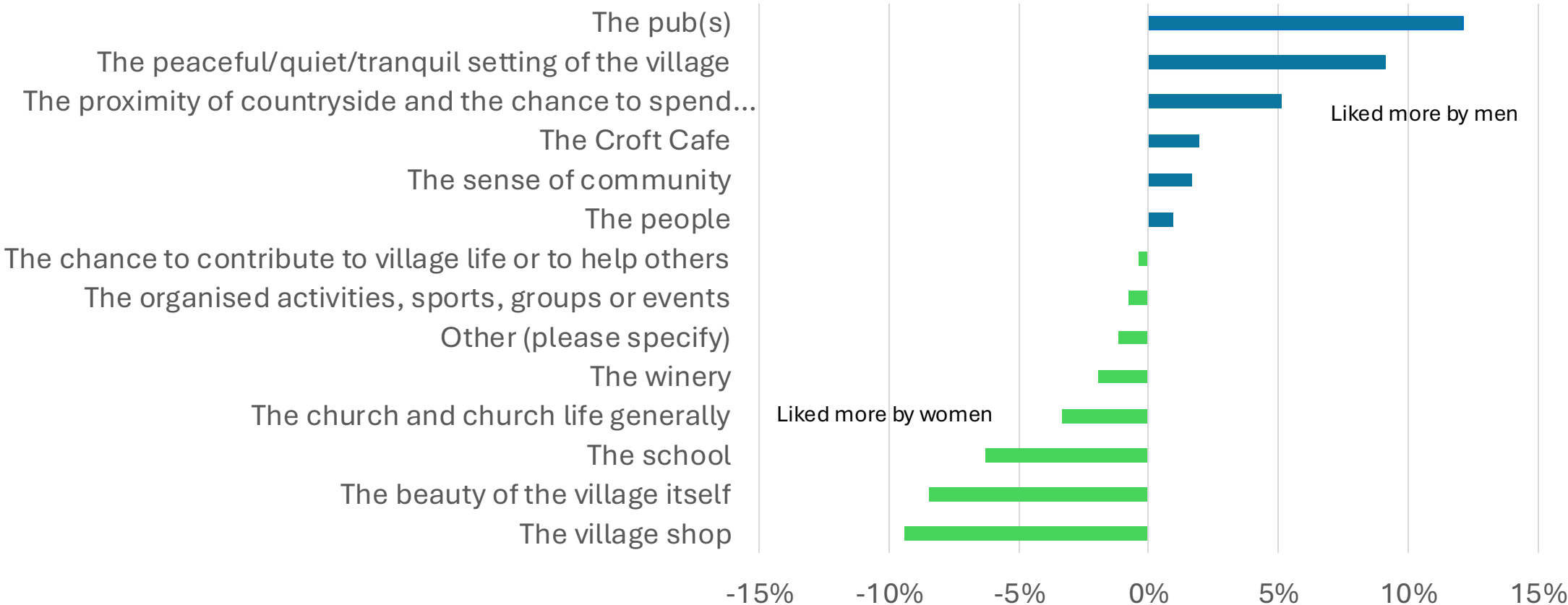

Men and women see things a bit differently

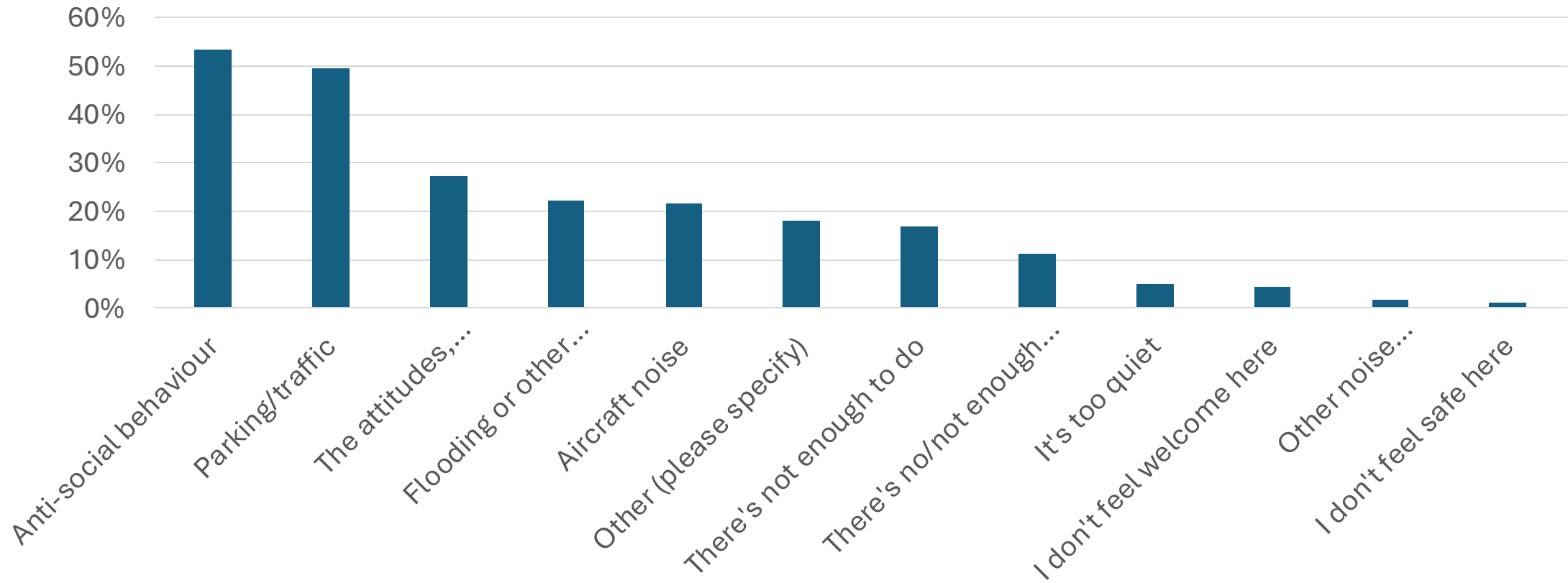
Apart from your own home and family, what do you like most about living in Crondall? How gender affects answers.



What do people like least?

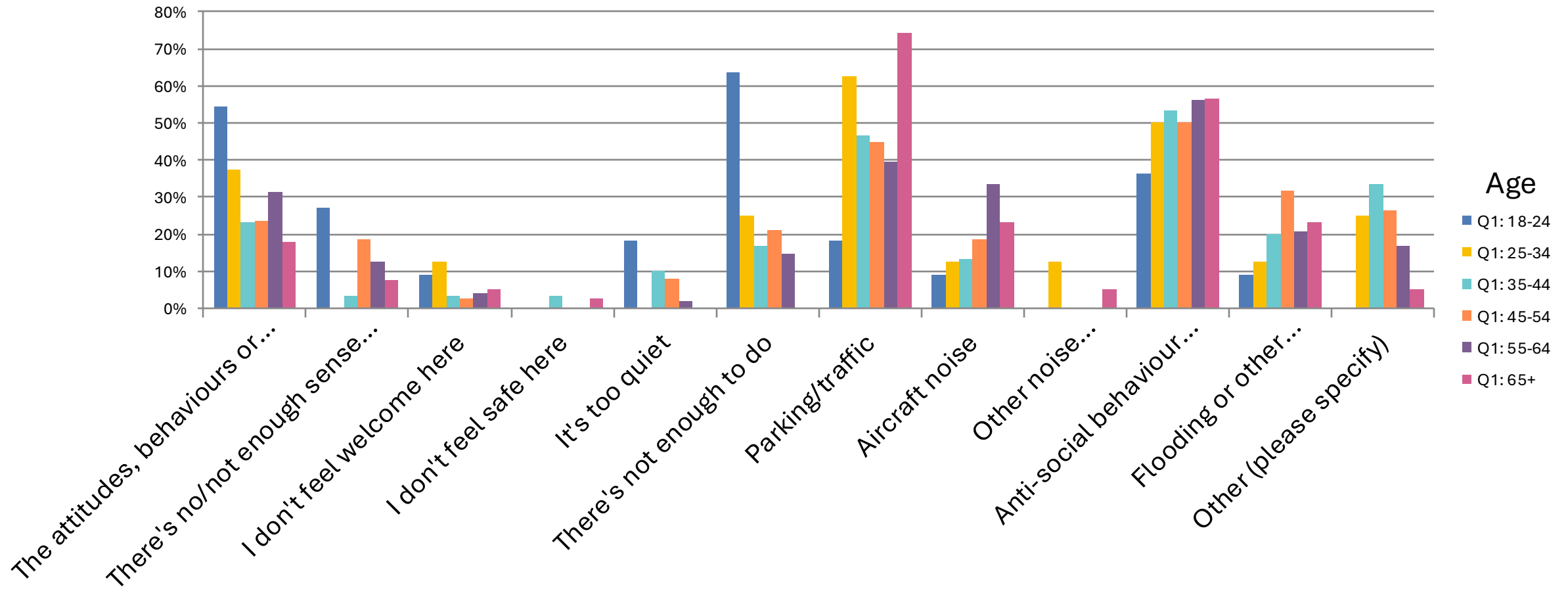
Apart from your own home and family, what do you like least about living in Crondall?

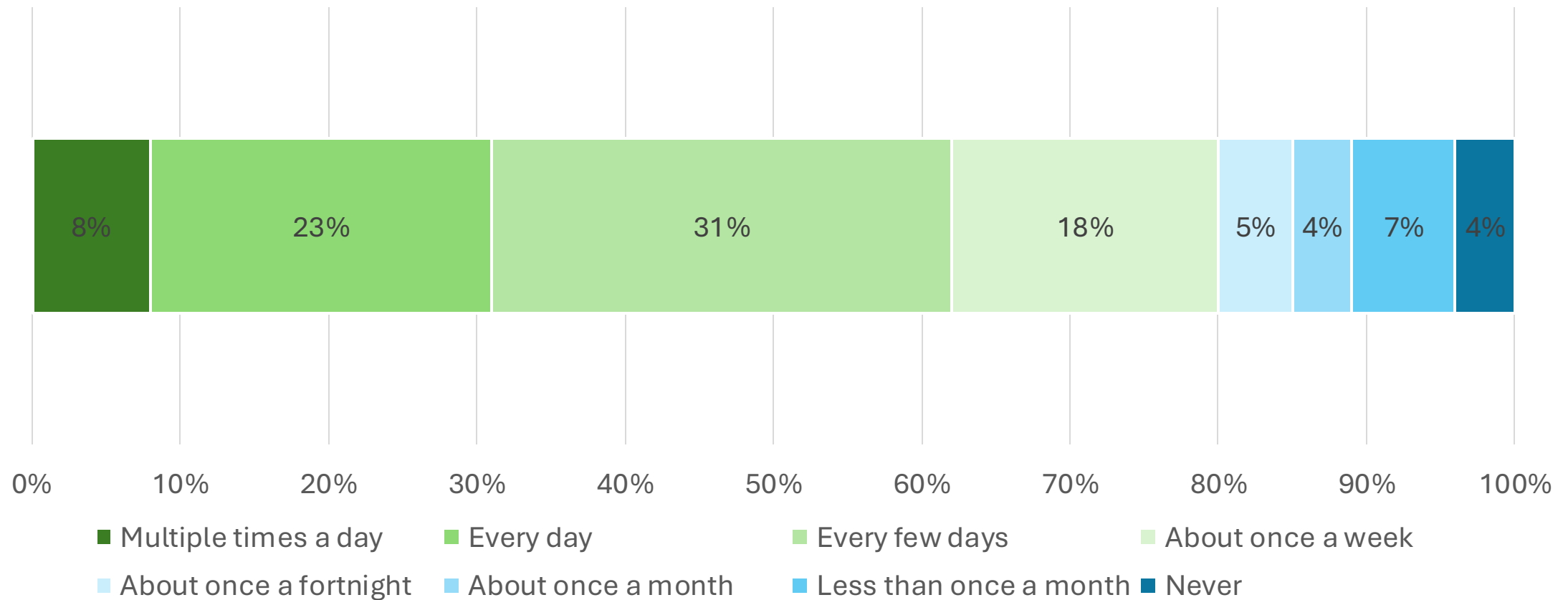
Young people have strikingly different views from others

Apart from your own home and family, what do you like least about living in Crondall? Comparing answers by age.



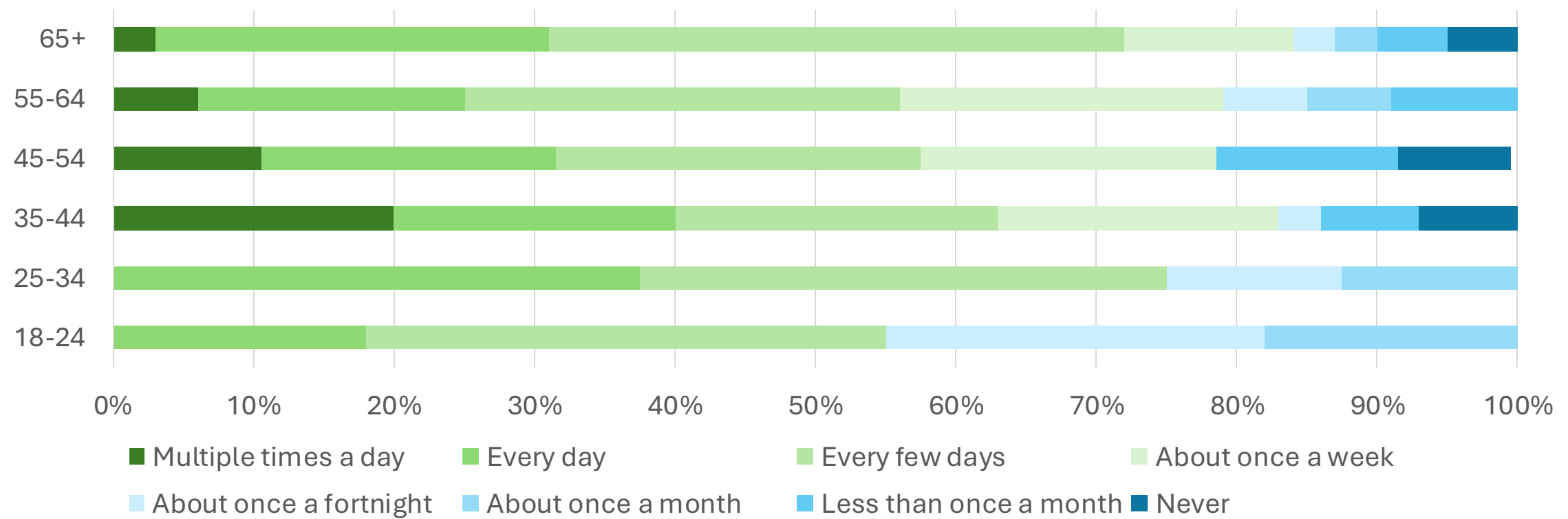
We're a sociable community

How often do you have any kind of interaction other than a quick exchange of greetings (saying hello, good morning etc) with other people in the village?



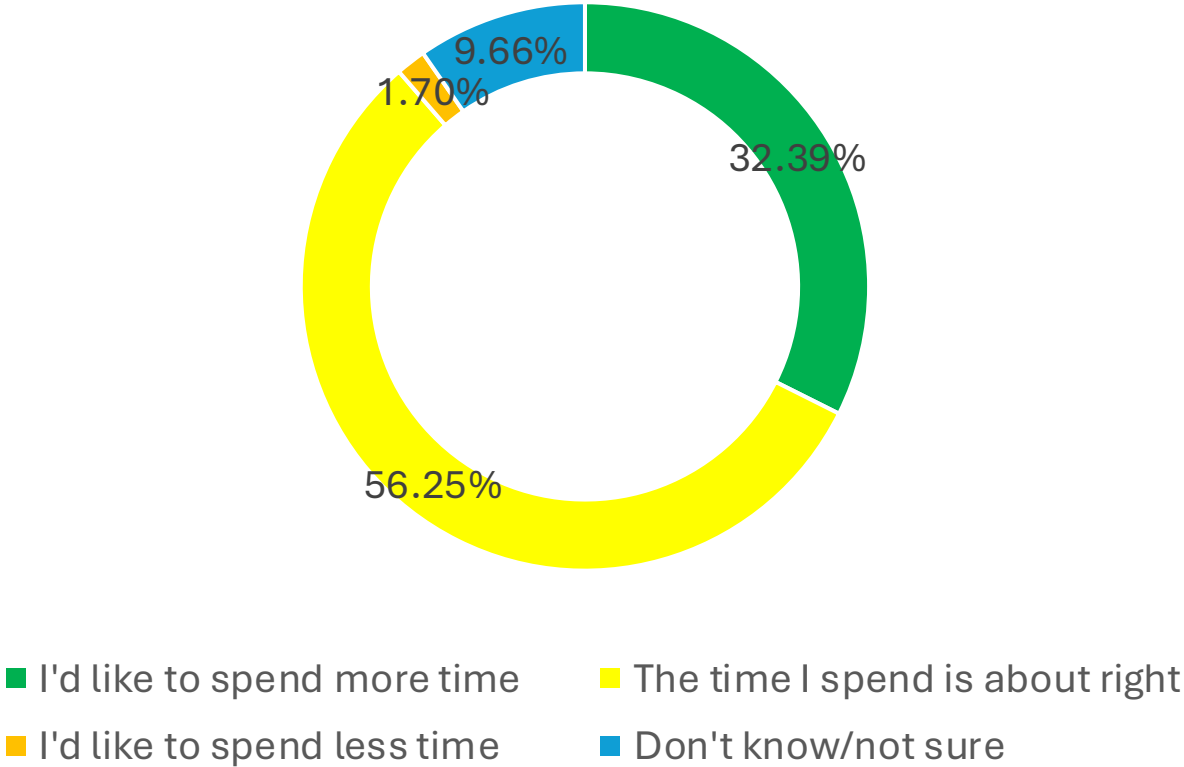
But age has a bearing on that, too

Comparing answers by age.



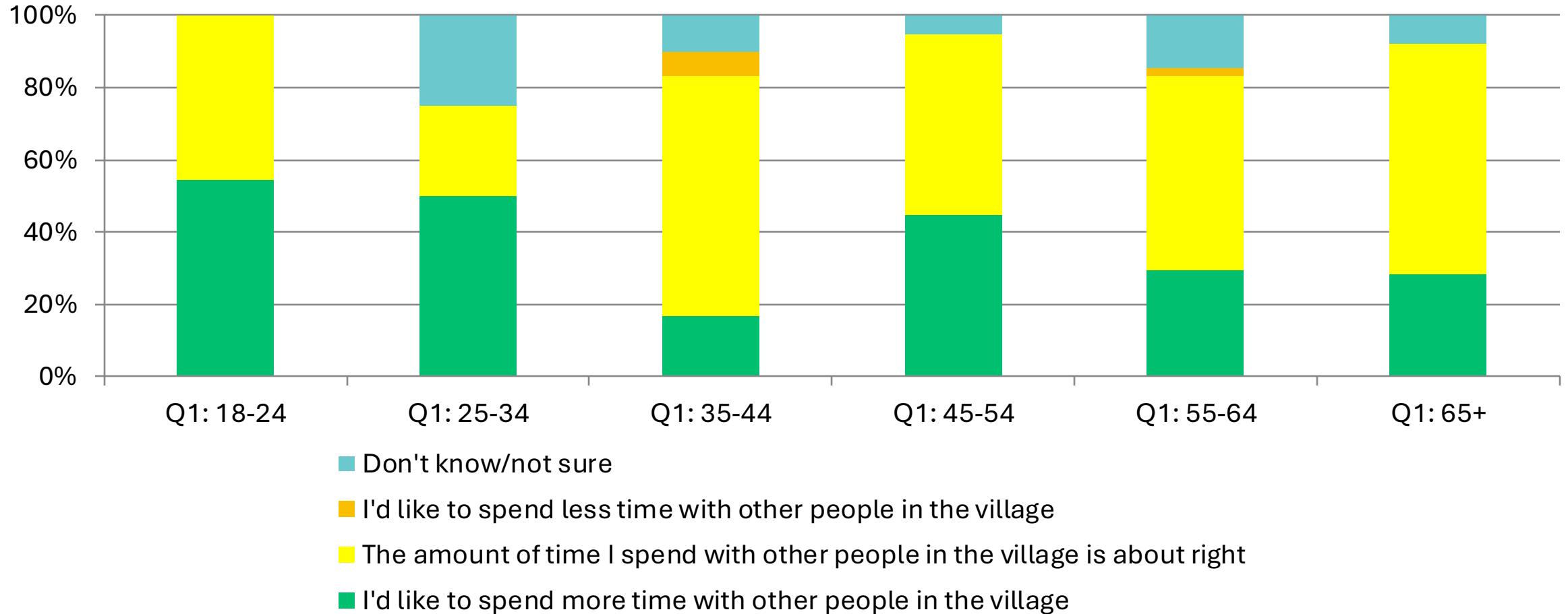
One in three people would like to spend more time with other people in the village

How do you feel about the amount of time you spend with other people in the village?



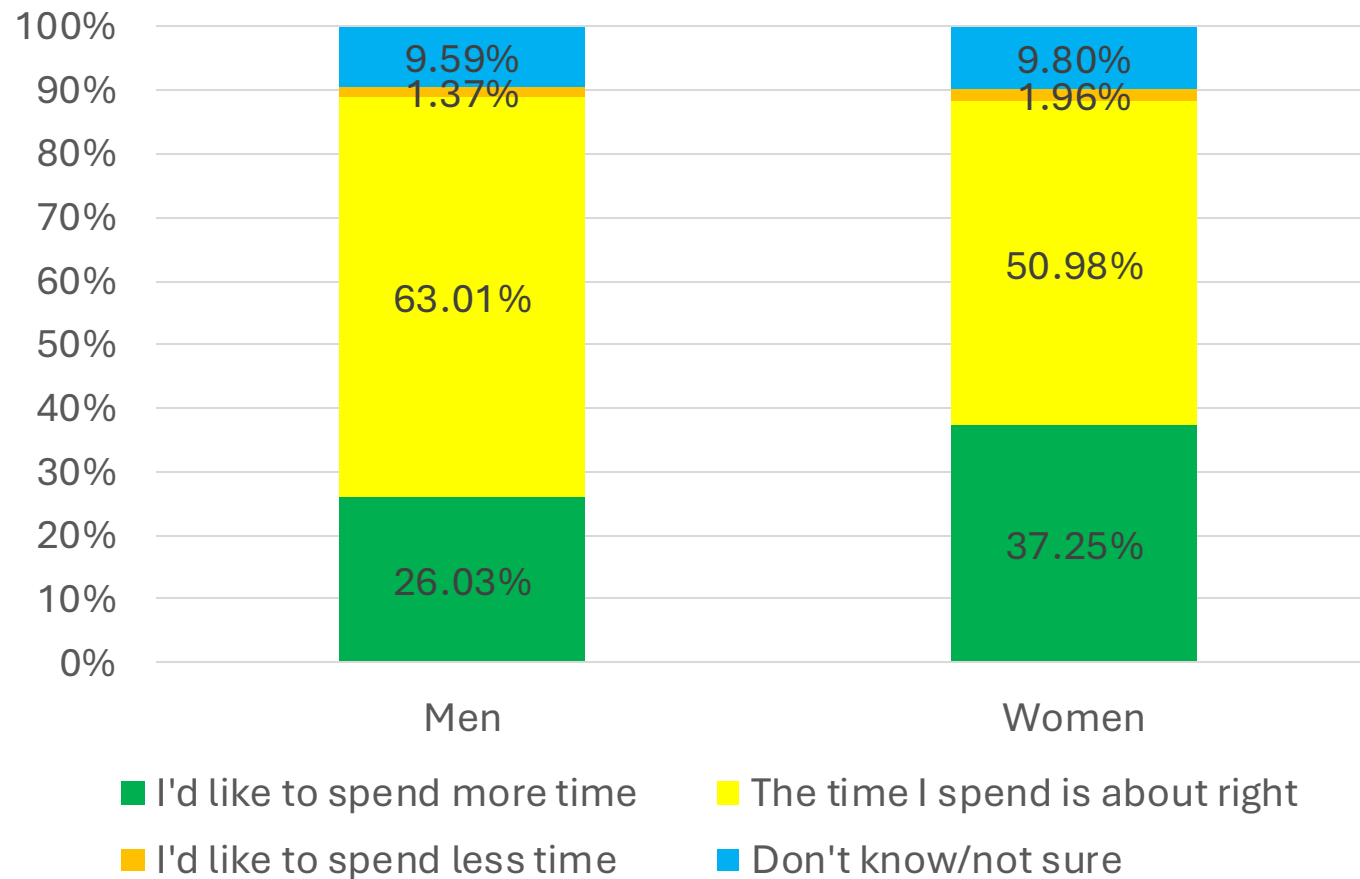
Young people are particularly in need of more interaction...

Comparing answers by age.



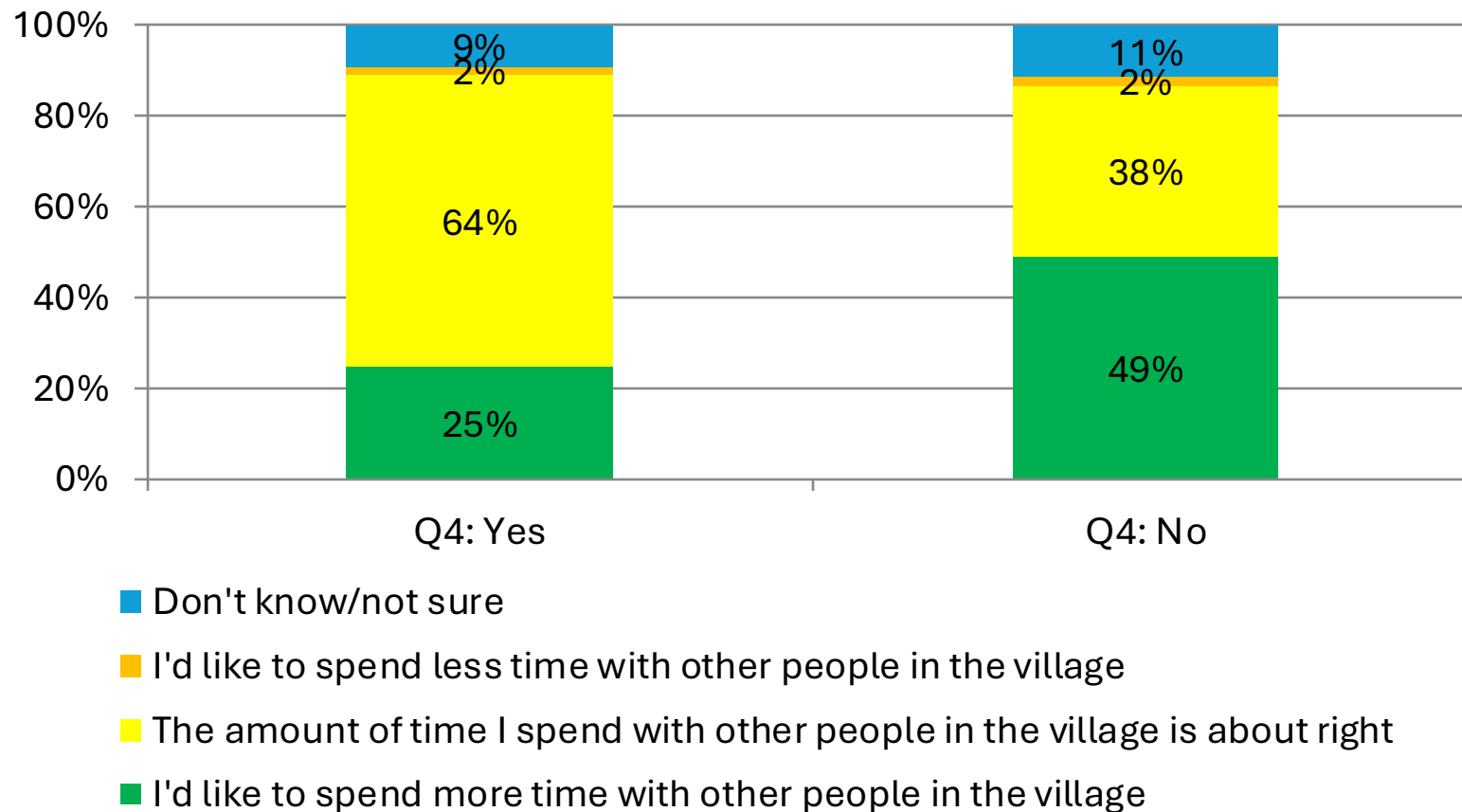
...as are women...

...but the biggest predictor of whether or not someone wants to spend more time with other people is whether they have children.

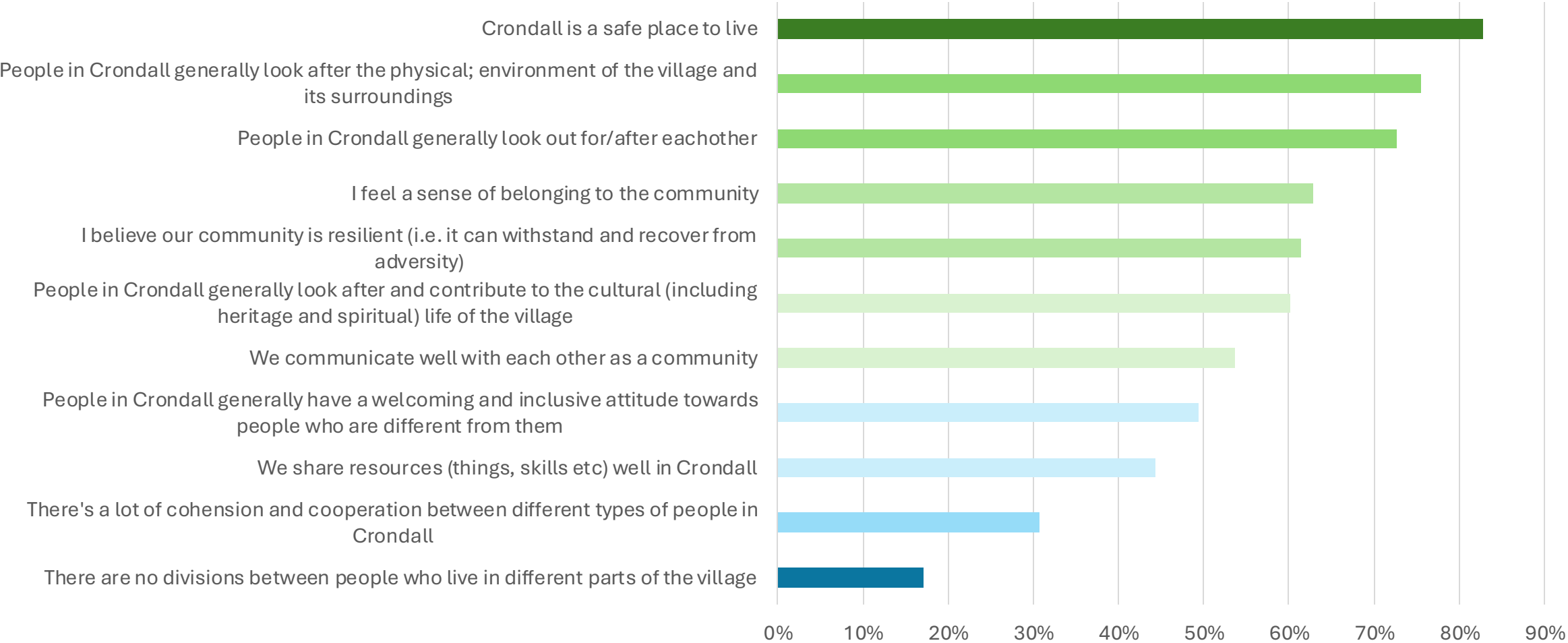
How do you feel about the amount of time you spend with other people in the village? Comparing answers based on whether or not people have children.

People with children

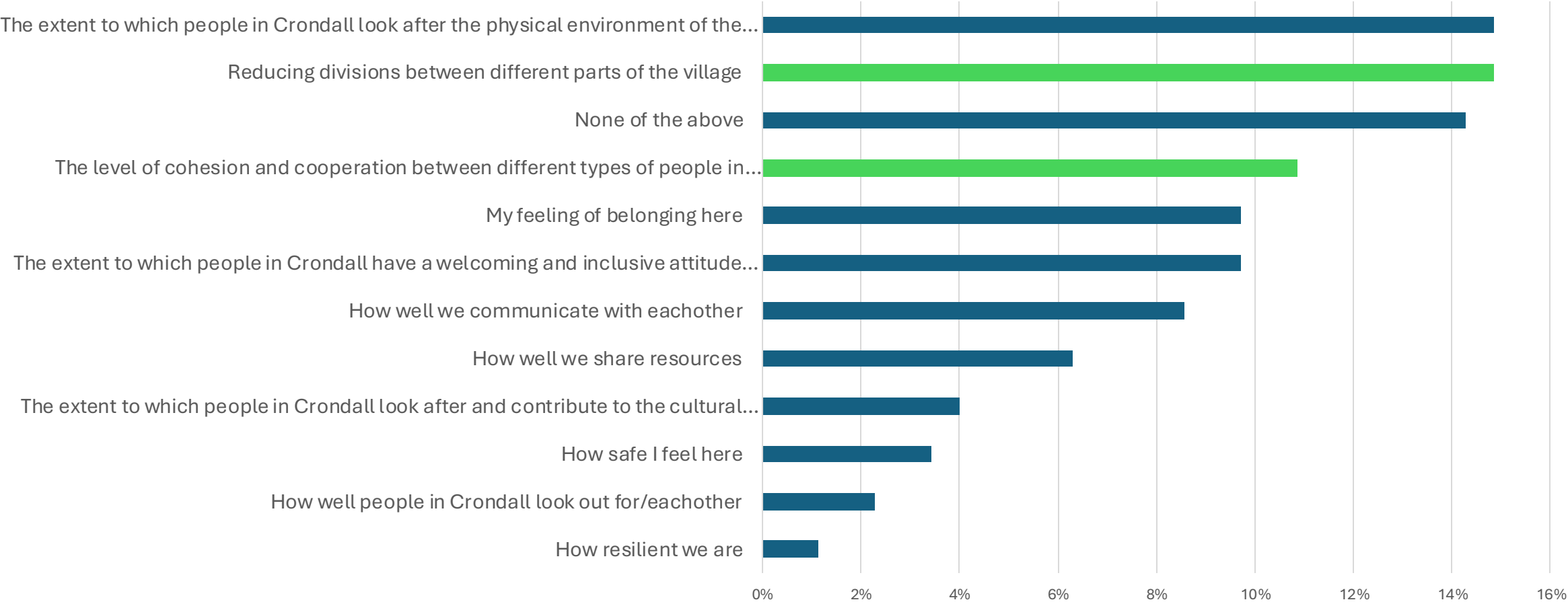
People aged 25-34

And that's the thing people would most like to change



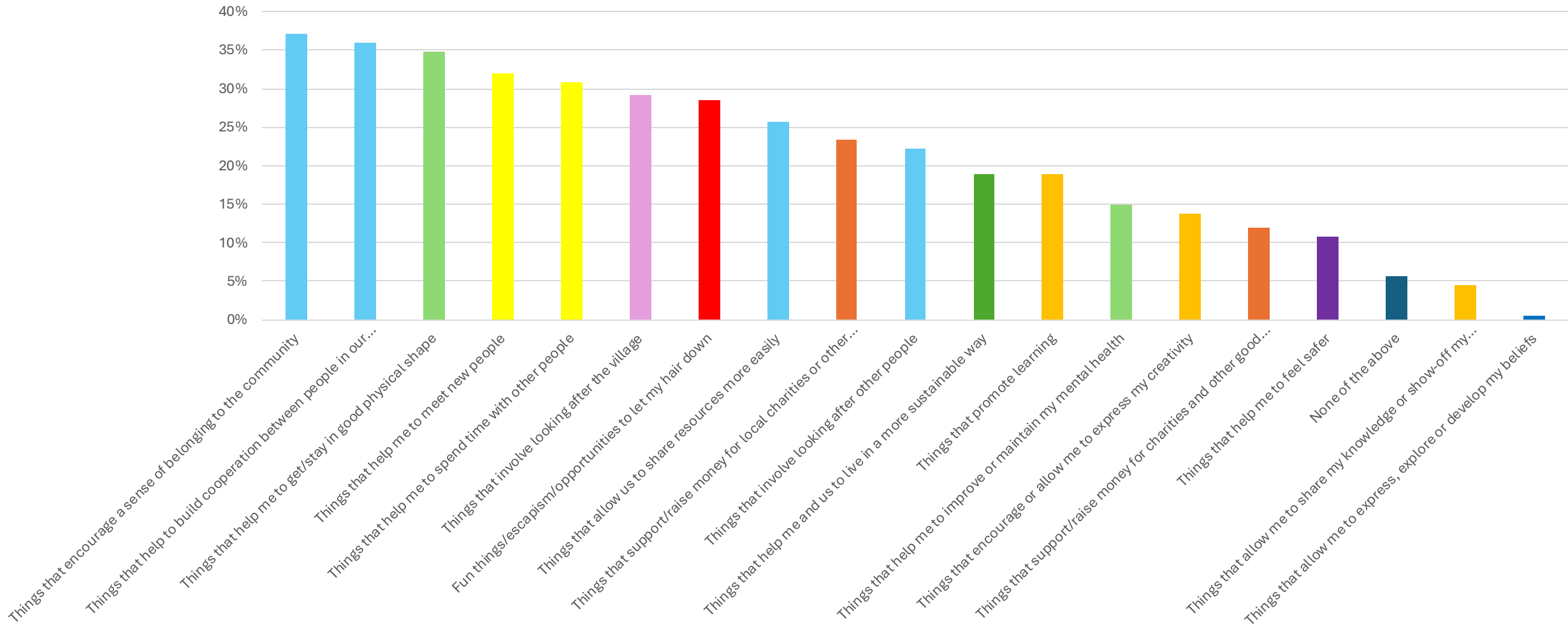
If you could improve the situation in respect of just ONE of those things, which would it be?

Conclusions

- Young people have a very different (and generally less positive) experience of life in Crondall, compared with older people
- World exclusive: Men like pubs!
- Life in Crondall might feel quite different depending on where you sit on the socio-economic spectrum
- Although we look after the physical environment of our village well, we want to do better
- Our main focus should be on things that increase cohesion, and reduce divisions, between different parts of our village. When we do, we should pay particular attention to women, young families and those with (relatively) low incomes.
